

Constitution and Bylaws Compilation: Delegates

Delegate Qualifications

All delegates:

- Must be:
 - U.S. Citizens
 - Registered Republicans
 - Residents of the Utah County precinct they are elected to represent
 - At least 18 years old by the next November General Election

(Constitution, Article IV, A)
- If a delegate resigns, dies, or moves out of the area he or she was elected to represent, he or she will no longer be a delegate.
(Bylaw2, D and E; Bylaw9, B)
- A delegate removed “for cause” will be ineligible to serve as a delegate during the next term.
(Bylaw5, D, 3; Bylaw9, C)
- Procedures for selecting delegates have been established by the Central Committee, in accordance with law and the County Party Constitution.
(Constitution, Article IV, R)

Precinct delegates:

- Must be elected in the precinct.
(Constitution, Article IV, A)

Ex Officio delegates:

- Are allocated according to the Ex Officio delegate formula.
(Bylaw1, A, 2, b and 3, b, c; Bylaw2, C; also see Delegate Allocation document)
- Ex Officio State Delegates must accept their delegate position in writing, by the deadline set by the Steering Committee, or their seat will revert back to the Ex Officio replacement procedures.
(Bylaw1, A, 5)

State Delegates and County Delegates

- State Delegates attend and vote at the State Nominating Convention, in even years, and the State Organizing Convention, in odd years.
(Constitution Article IV, R)
- County Delegates attend and vote at the County Nominating Convention, in even years, and the County Organizing Convention, in odd years.
(Constitution Article IV, R)
